5 reasons to come home:

- 1) **Catholicism is true!** The only really good reason to believe something is because it is true, and Catholicism is true! The Catholic Church is the one Church established by Christ 2000 years ago (Matthew 16:18). It is the Church to which God calls all of His universal family to belong. The Catholic Church offers us deep union with Christ through the Scripture, Sacraments, prayer, and community.
- 2) **The Catholic Church has the Sacraments- and we especially long for the Eucharist.** It is in the Catholic Church that you experience the fullness of the seven sacraments, which Christ bestows on His Church to help us fill with grace to draw us closer to God.
